This year will our 9th to partner with the Kentucky State Police to offer the Museum in Motion: Kentucky One Lap events. Due to overwhelming interest, we offer the tour four consecutive weeks! Proceeds benefit not only the Museum, but also Trooper Island, a non-profit camp for underprivileged children.

The trip begins at General Butler State Park Resort in Carrollton, Kentucky - traveling to Makers Mark Distillery for a tour, tastings, shopping and lunch. On day two, the group will venture to Williamstown, KY to visit the Ark Encounter - a life size Noah's Ark with buffet lunch at the Ark. Other activities include a tour of the Louisville Slugger Museum and Factory, Kentucky Derby Museum, lunch cruise on the Mary M. Miller Riverboat. Weeks 1, 2 and 3 will visit Taylormade Farms and Keeneland while week 4 will visit Buffalo Trace Distillery and the Kentucky Horse Park.
